<div>Albert the Bull park is a nexus for community events. Almost all groups identified the ball fields and events such as music in the park as assets to the community.</div> <div>Broadway street is a popular destination. Businesses, such as the Broadway Bakery and the Rose Theater, and is wheel chair accessible.</div> <div>The Rec Center is one of the most popular destination amenity to keep in shape and to get around town.</div> <div>All user groups value T-Bone Trail as a recreational site amenities, such as benches and sidewalks around City Square and Legion Parks as assets. The mobility impaired group appreciates the good lighting downtown.</div> <div>All user groups recognize outdoor recreation as valuable in Audubon. Features such as trails, tracks, ball fields, tennis courts, and soccer fields were identified as important.</div> <div>Residents often walk in the streets due to the missing or broken sidewalks in Audubon. The mobility impaired group noted a lack of curb cuts and sidewalk accessibility.</div> <div>Highway 71 is difficult for drivers and pedestrians to cross due to speeding traffic and abundance of semis. Sidewalks are also not present in many places along 71, creating issues when entering the sports complex.</div> <div>Accessing Albert the Bull Park can feel unsafe during events because sidewalks and street crossings are missing. Congestion and parked vehicles makes it difficult for pedestrians to see and walk.</div> <div>Flooding throughout Audubon is a barrier to walking and biking. Areas identified include Albert the Bull park, Market Street, and the intersection of Highway 71 and Division Street.</div> <div>It is difficult to access Albert the Bull Park from T-Bone Trail or Highway 71 due to a lack of sidewalks, no safe bridge crossing, and traffic--especially during events.</div> <div>Highway 71 is a strong asset for Audubon. However, residents would like safe, controlled road crossings, cohesive signage, and shade trees.</div> <div>Residents desire sidewalks. A walking path that connects major locations such as the Rec Center and schools would facilitate access for all residents.</div> <div>The T-Bone Trail and other bike and pedestrian routes need shade, mile markers and lighting in key areas. Actives and the steering committee suggest a bridge for pedestrian to get to Albert the Bull Park.</div> <div>Albert the Bull park needs additional sidewalks, trail connections to nearby amenities, and improved parking/signage.</div>
