Meeting Summary: This meeting transitions from the information gathering phase of the process to the design phase of the process. The Visioning committee started by sharing highlights of the information gathered during the Transportation Assets and Barriers Focus Group workshop (TAB), the Bioregional Assessment exercise and the Transportation Partners meetings in preparation for goal setting. Display boards containing information gleaned from the TAB and from Bioregional Assessment were present. The committee told about trends and preparing to converse as a group about what the community has expressed as Carlisle's transportation strengths, challenges, and improvement desires. The committee shared the information with the design team: made up of Bruce Niedermyer and Sarah Davids of RDG Planning & Design.

A few comments made by the committee:

- Many comments about traffic and pedestrians and bikes along Highway 5.
- We have some trails that are similar to wide sidewalks and the public does not understand they can ride bikes on them. So there is confusion where the bikes should be. On the sidewalk or road surface?
- McClure Engineering is doing 3 plans or studies for Carlisle.
- What can be done for bike signage?
- A review was made of the Architect Foundations work in town. Next step involves selecting planters, benches and bike racks.
- There is more foot traffic along Scotch Ridge Road now.
- Some discussion on continuing "The Natural Place" theme for town.

We then created a list of possible solutions for the issues identified while reviewing TAB workshop and other materials. After the first list was made, similar projects were lumped with like smaller projects. A fuller list of potential projects/ solutions was created. When the conversation wrapped up the committee voted on projects they saw as priorities for the design team to focus on. Results are shown below.
