kids are walking home, they're walking on the street...that's not ideal for some of those... "I think [business middle school kids, and you've got high schoolers [who] are driving past, so that's a little bit of a concern."

Parents

"...King Street from the high

school down to the main road

[has] no sidewalk...so when the

owners] feel like they lose a lot of business because the plowing [along the highway] isn't ideal for people that need to get out of their vehicles, get into restaurants and things like that."

> "I love how wide [the FIT trail] is, and I like the fact that you can hop on it and it takes you down to the little league field."

"I run a lot, and we don't have consistent sidewalks through town... there's nothing more frustrating than... having your sidewalk end, having to get onto the road, back onto the sidewalk. Or you could just stay on the road, but then people look at you, like, 'Why are you running in our way?'"

"...It just seems like the businesses aren't really made a priority in town as far as snow removal goes. If it snows in the morning, it's for sure going to be a super slow day for us, and that needs

[to be] worked on."

"I love the idea of doing more

trails, whether [they're] paved

or unpaved...towards the river. I

think [the river is] an underutilized

asset that we have, and [a trail

to the river] could give you more

access to nature than even the

trail by the lake does."

"I love walking along the lake to just have pretty scenery, stuff to look at and just change of pace."

"We ride our bikes mostly on the trail, sometimes around town. I would be more apt to ride my bike downtown to do business if there was a place to lock it...Emmetsburg is safe...but I'm not willing to leave my bike unlocked somewhere."

"...Lake Shore Drive...[is] a very busy street

because of the lake use, and the sunset walks,

bicycling, young adults with children in strollers

literally most every day year-round...There are

cars coming from each direction, and [when]

there's someone walking a child on that road...

they have to get off in the grass...I'd like to see

that made into a one-way street going north."

"...to cross the highway, I think we should have one of those [Rapid Flashing Beacons] to press the button and then you could walk."

"The [sidewalk along]the highway is very smooth and you don't trip or [have] rocks go under your shoes."

"Obviously the trail

seems to be a hot topic

for people. I definitely

think [for] those [who]

are impaired some, it is

very nice to be able to

have an area to exercise,

to walk, to bike..."

Youth

"I usually roller blade on

the bike trail because

it's softer, and it's easier

to get to my aunt's

house, because there's

a bike trail going all the

way..."

"I usually walk sometimes to Dollar General to get some stuff, but there's a lot of traffic [on Hwy 18/4], so it's hard to cross."

"When [we] go to school

[on 7th Street] there's a

sidewalk, then it ends,

and then there's a

sidewalk again, and it

gets really, really bumpy."

"...there's adequate handicapped parking at the grocery stores. [We] probably could use something at the post office...most of the town is laid out pretty well with handicapped parking...the Hughes Pharmacy doesn't have anything right out front for handicapped. You have to pull into their parking area, but I get around fine with a pickup and a cane, and on

the trails I use a walker."

"It would be nice if they could fix some of the potholes on some of the side streets, because l didn't realize how bad the potholes were on [King] Street until I rode my bike down it."

> "I've also noticed that even if there is a sidewalk, it is so broken up that you cannot roll a wheelchair over it."

"[We would like to connect] all the points of interest so that it's easy to get there on a bike or walking versus having to get in a vehicle and go somewhere... and then connecting them with the downtown to help grow downtown business and foot traffic."

"I would love for the

long side of the lake

to be connected.

They have started

a trail on the other

side. It would be

awesome if it could

have a trail all the

way around."

"We tend to walk on

the road because

our stroller doesn't

fit [on the sidewalk],

or even the quality

of the sidewalks—if

there is a sidewalk—

is very poor."

"...general way-finding signage is totally lacking throughout the community...beyond directing you to the lake, we don't have anything really in the downtown besides whatever random signage the state has put up."

"...people talk about [how hard it is] crossing the highway to get to Harrison Park, especially [for] little kids. It's on a hill and it's not great visibility, and if I walked around Harrison [Park], then I might have to wait a while before I can cross [Highway 18]."

> "I use the trail quite a bit when it's warm, and otherwise if I'm not walking on the trail, I am just probably walking on the street in residential areas, not so much [on the] sidewalks."

Steering Committee

"One intersection that floods regularly with general rains is Lawler [Street] and Highway 18. That intersection... gets pretty deep sometimes."

"The crosswalks...have actually become [less safe] because [drivers] stop in the right-hand lane to let [pedestrians cross], [but] the vehicle in the left lane that is maybe a short ways behind can't see the person crossing in front of that first car that stopped."

'...from Lawler going west on 1st Street out to the hospital, people are on the street all the time... the ambulance comes along, they're still in the street. It's a problem in my opinion..."

"... I think the priority for me-if we're looking at walker safety, student safety, public safetywould be sidewalk from 1st Street to...College Drive on Lawler."

"The library/wellness center...parking lot is awful...It's full of ruts. Older people have a hard time accessing...the library or even the wellness center. They do have handicapped parking, but you have to walk a long way once you park in the handicapped parking lot to get in."

"Not having a crosswalk or...some place to control the traffic along Highway 18 can sometimes [be] a barrier to accessing The Shores on the other side of Highway 18."
