

# What Matters to Garrison Residents



Actives primarily walk and run, but also bike and drive. They are most bothered by poor sidewalk and road conditions. Actives desire more lighting, drinking fountains, and an indoor recreation facility.

Seniors and mobility-impaired individuals drive to most of their destinations, but occasionally walk. They are concerned about streets, sidewalks, and stormwater infrastructure. The group wants more traffic controls on Maple Street and Sycamore Avenue, as well as trees and trash cans.

The major modes of transportation for youth are walking or biking, and adults often drive them places. The youth group focused on a lack of sidewalks and bike routes. More places for recreational activities is a common desire for this group.

Parents drive and walk to most destinations. This group is concerned with controlling vehicular traffic and creating a consistent network of sidewalks, street lighting, and signage throughout town.

The steering committee members primarily walk and drive to destinations. This group is concerned with roads, sidewalks, and stormwater infrastructure. They desire improved lighting and trail connections into Garrison.
