

Proposed Street Section

Prioritized Pedestrian Routes

Data provided during the community assessment indicate the value residents place on walking (see board 3c). Each user group expressed a desire to expand connections to the existing trail/sidewalk system. Development of a connected trail/sidewalk network will provide safer mobility and increased recreation opportunities among community destinations and amenities.

The design team worked with community members to identify destinations and desired walking routes within Graettinger. These routes are depicted as the sidewalks/trails plan. Anticipated lengths for each segment have also been provided. A typical section indicating how the community could begin realizing these links was developed to show spatial needs. This section depicts a landscaped buffer for street trees, lawn or other landscaping separating a 5' sidewalk or 8' trail section within the public right-of-way.

This section will need to be adjusted based on right-of-way width, utilities, and existing objects on each property where an improved route is considered for implementation.
