**Mid-Range Goals:**

- Implement an inviting trailhead and promote trail use
- Designated and signed biking and walking trails downtown
- Bandshell Park and streetscape improvement plan
- Expansion of disc golf course to 18 holes
- Pocket parks
- Signage on south entry into town
- Lighting improvements along trails
- Railroad purchase for trail route between Olive and Nettle

- Enhance Suicide Hill for year-round use
- Establish permanent mini golf course
- Rain gardens
- Trail route from Sheffield to Beeds Lake
- Improve trail walkability
- Dedicated play area at East Park

**Short-Range Goals:**

- Create more high-quality, low maintenance natural areas
- Regulation soccer field
- Universal signage and way-finding
- Connect downtown to Progress Park Trail
- Community entry sign enhancements
- Ice cream shop
- Lighting and streetscape enhancements downtown (banners)
- Mini golf along the trail
- Trail way-finding and interpretive elements
- More trees along Highway 3
- Develop more recreational activities at East Park
- More activities for youth
- Make East Park more attractive
- Marketing and branding for recreation assets
- Connecting community parks via designated trails and routes
