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## **Meeting Summary:**

The Hampton Visioning Committee met in the basement of the United Methodist Church in Hampton for their September meeting. Trees Forever Field Coordinator Jeff Jensen started the meeting asking for any feedback from SummerFest. The consensus was that the weather cooperated, the display boards were nice and sparked discussion, and that it was an overall excellent day.

Next, the committee discussed the Annual Celebration on Thursday, Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> at the Gateway Center in Ames. Jeff highlighted what to expect and invited the entire committee to come and participate. Recognizing that it may not be possible for the entire committee to attend he advised that we would need at least 2 individuals to commit. Sue Wulf and Newt agreed to participate. Jeff stressed the importance of having four boards to share and offered to take the four boards with him to ensure they made it. Sue and Newt advised they would be able to bring them when they came.

Next, Eric Doll with Jeffrey L Bruce & Company handed out the feasibility study and began going through the document. Eric did a nice job leading the committee through how the document was put together; and highlighting the assessment sections which really guided the final projects in the feasibility study, and helping them understand how to use it. The bulk of the time was spent focusing on the various projects and understanding how the financial figures were put together to inform the committee of costs. It was really good how Eric broke down many projects into phases that could be implemented as smaller projects working towards some of the bigger goals outlined in the feasibility report.

Finally, the committee discussed a meeting in October. A consensus emerged to meet in Oct. with Jeff agreeing to send at least three potential dates out to the committee to select from.

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
