Boehner Park is a quiet retreat for visitors that features a connection to the Wabash Trace Trail, RV campsites, a two-acre, freshwater fed pond, a quarter-mile walking trail surrounding the pond, a wetland restoration area, and a woodland area. The vision for the park as described by the committee is as a place for children to play, families to make memories, and a regular stop for Wabash Trace Trail users. In order to meet ADA standards, accessible parking, sidewalks to the shelters, and a compliant railing on the existing fishing jetty are needed. The pond needs to be dredged to remove sedimentation and will require a liner to maintain a consistent water level; this will allow the pond to be stocked with fish and provide another amenity. New park shelters, restroom and bathhouse are desired. Creating an inclusive nature play area near the existing play area is desired to offer discovery play for all ages. Creating a diverse plant habitat along the pond edge with native plantings and a multi-tiered fishing overlook will aid in stabilizing the pond's edge and create habitat for fish and other wildlife. New entry signage, way-finding signage, wifi and park security are also included to ensure the safety of all park visitors.
