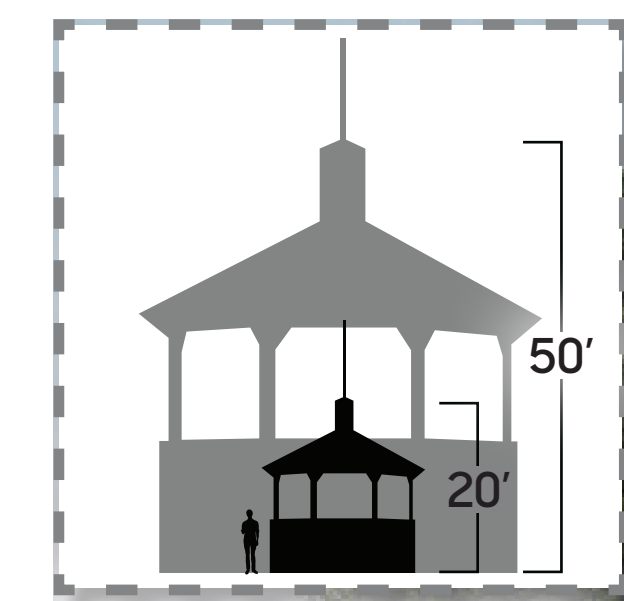


- 50' Bandshell Structure

The bandstand located at the city square has been noted as a local landmark as well as a community icon. The idea of utilizing this structure throughout the community was envisioned by the steering committee to further develop the community's identity.

As new trailheads are fitted to be located adjacent to the Neal Smith and High Trestle Trails, the bandstand structure is envisioned to serve as a community landmark and threshold to invite and welcome trail users to Polk City. The skeletal structure is to take the form of the bandstand, including the "lightning rod," and provide historical and trail way-finding information throughout town. Art and native plantings are also envisioned to round out the regional trail point of connections.
