Existing Signage

Polk City currently has many different types of identity and way-finding signs located throughout town (shown on the map at left) as a means of welcoming people to the community, providing direction to key locations, and defining large destinations such as city parks.

These signs have existing similarities, including the Polk City logo, motto, and similar colors. However, they lack a cohesive design that ties the community together. By reassessing both signage placement and design, the key amenities in the community will be more easily accessible, and Polk City residents will feel a sense of pride in their new community identity.














Inspiration from Saylorville Lake


