## Transportation Inventory and Analysis

Knowledge of the transportation system in and around a community is critical for sustainable transportation enhancement planning. Stanton's transportation system includes a state highway, two county roads, local streets, waterways, sidewalks, and recreational trails.

County Road M63 runs through the middle of town in the north-south direction and is the primary vehicular route as you enter town. This road gets the heaviest traffic in the morning and late afternoon.

The visioning team coordinated with Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) personnel, the Montgomery County Engineer, and local officials to identify existing, past, and future transportation-related constraints and opportunities in the Stanton area.

Stanton has many transportation-based assets and opportunities that include the community trail, Anderson Park, Alamosa Park, Randy Larson Memorial Park, and Stanton Technology Park.

Items of concern include a need for safer circulation for children and accessibility downtown. The community would also like to see amenities added to the parks throughout the town, and a trailhead for the community trail.
