Stanton residents and committee members expressed the desire to complete the looped trail system, develop a trail routed to Viking Lake State Park, create safer pedestrian connections and crossings, and provide more recreation trails.

A community trail loop is routed to connect residents to Little Tarkio Creek, existing open spaces and parks, and proposed open space destinations and developments such as the new technology park on the north side of town.

The community looped trail system is 2.5 miles, of which 1 mile is a proposed paved trail route. The proposed trail leading to Viking Lake State Park is 3 miles long. The increase in trail mileage requires trail amenities such as defined trailhead locations, seating/rest areas, and bicycle repair stations similar to those in the images seen below.
