

Sculpture Park

Stanton’s identity will be enhanced by creating a sculpture park as the centerpiece of the primary entrance into town.

The 5.5-acre sculpture park features a Dala horse sculpture nestled on an earthen berm to anchor the park space and draw people into the community from the highly travelled Highway 34. The sculpture is a symbol of Stanton’s history and heritage.

This park space not only functions as community identity, but provides a much needed trailhead for the community looped trail system. Within the park, there is a smaller (0.25 mile) looped fitness trail that traverses the perimeter of the park parcel.

There are also a small gathering area at the north corner of the park, and a fitness station on the south leg of the trail loop. Within the interior of the park’s trail loop, a native planting area provides a nice habitat for birds and pollinators.
