<p>City Park is popular among all demographic types. Youth enjoy having a place to gather with friends, while adults value the restrooms and band shell. Mobility-impaired individuals appreciate the church services held in the band shell, but would like to see it restored.</p> <p>Both youth and adult user types value the track. Mobility-impaired individuals like that they can walk on the track but wish there were designated hours for public use. Youth noted that the track is a great place to hang out with friends.</p> <p>All user types walk around town for exercise. Participants walk in the streets because of the poor sidewalk conditions and the lack of sidewalks in most places.</p> <p>Residents appreciate recreation areas, such as parks and trails. They would like more paved trails and walking areas throughout town.</p> <p>Older adults, mobility-impaired individuals, and steering committee members, and parents noted the importance of accessibility at the city park. Specifically, they identified the lack of a sidewalk or trail and the uneven surface as barriers.</p> <p>All demographic groups value a complete, smooth sidewalk system in town. Parents noted the lack of a sidewalk or trail and the uneven surface as barriers.</p> <p>Residents consider the lack of a complete, smooth sidewalk system in town as a barrier. Youth would like to see conditions of the sidewalks and streets improved.</p> <p>All demographic types consider the lack of a public, paved trail a barrier in Wellsburg. Participants would like to see the trail have an easy access point and parking nearby.</p> <p>Nearly all user types mentioned that there are areas of low visibility throughout town, particularly at the intersection of McAdoo and Washington Streets.</p> <p>Residents view the city park as an asset with potential for more activity and gatherings. Particularly, the band shell needs to be restored, the play equipment needs to be improved, and the ground needs to be leveled for easy accessibility.</p> <p>Ice on roads and sidewalks is a barrier around town. Specifically, the intersection of Monroe and 4th Street has a large dip in the cement that causes a buildup of snow, water, and ice.</p> <p>All user types suggested adding a public, paved trail with amenities such as benches, shade trees, trash receptacles, water fountains, and parking.</p> <p>Residents would like to see improvements made to the city park. Adults would like to have a paved surface that goes through the park, and more parking. Youth would like new play equipment.</p> <p>Participants would like to see a complete sidewalk system throughout town and existing sidewalks, such as those on N Adams Street, repaired.</p> <p>Parents, youth, actives, and older adults expressed the desire to improve the track. Youth would like the track to be certified for track meets, while adults would like to see the track paved for all seasons.</p>
